Signal Hill UMC has had a long association with the Signal Hill School, located just across Signal Hill Place from the church. In 1910, a Sunday School began under a tree in back of the old Signal Hill School. With cooler weather, the group obtained permission to meet in the fourth grade classroom. Today, the association with the school continues – every Wednesday, the church hosts Kids Kount, an after-school program.




Robert M. Peters was the first student pastor of the new congregation. This prayer card dates from 1910.
