In late December, the staff parish relations committee approved the hiring of Eda Hackmann as the new Director of Music Ministry. Hackmann is currently a student at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis. She holds a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Illinois and a Master of Church Music from Pensacola Theological Seminary.



"Eda's main responsibility will be to work with me to develop the second worship service," explained directing pastor Peter Wehrly. "We are also looking forward to her assistance in selecting music for all services and scheduling special music."

Hackmann, a resident of Fairview Heights, has worked in staff and volunteer capacities at churches around the area, including Edgemont Bible Church, Christ United Methodist Church and Benld United Methodist Church.

"We welcome Eda to our staff and look forward to her ministry with our church," said Paul Vallina, SPRC chair.
