"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." (Galatians 5:22 NIV)

We are in the midst of challenging economic times. Every day the news is filled with the worsening effects of the recession. For those with pension plans, retirement incomes are dwindling with each passing month. It can become very easy to lose sight of what is really important.

'While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.' (Romans 5:8 NIV) This, I believe is what our eyes should focus on.
